
# WELCOME TO 5M

# HOMEWORK POLICY

Among the many talents and skills students acquire during the elementary school years, responsibility and organization carry tremendous importance for success both in school and in the future. Homework gives students an opportunity to think about, practice, and review what they've learned at school. It also enables students to learn how to manage their time and their learning materials.

### HOW OFTEN IS HOMEWORK ASSIGNED?

Students are assigned homework every school night. This will include 30 minutes of nightly reading which they will record in a weekly reading log and any additional practice in other classes. Homework provides students the opportunity to practice their learning, to prepare for upcoming class lessons, and to develop responsibility. On Monday through Thursday students are expected to complete their homework in a timely manner.

#### WHAT IF MY CHILD MISSES AN ASSIGNMENT?

In the event that a student misses a homework assignment, a discussion between the student and the teacher will occur. Parents will be notified if a child is missing homework on a consistent basis.

Provide a quiet, consistent study place
Decide with your child on a predictable daily homework routine
Show support for homework's importance

Assign homework that is meaningful and reasonable

# UNIFORM

Daily adherence to school uniform codes and to other clothing standards is required of all students at The Laurel Hill School. Dressing for Laurel Hill is a "flag" of membership in our learning community and an acknowledgement that education is a precious and revered gift. Keeping to the school dress code, as with all other school regulations, expresses a student's desire to meet his/her personal responsibility to The Laurel Hill School. The following are the guidelines set in place by The Laurel Hill School.

#### **Guidelines for girls:**

Jumpers Skirts Uniform Shorts only Uniform slacks LHS Golf Shirt (with logo) Closed shoes only (black or brown leather)

#### **Guidelines for boys:**

Uniform slacks Uniform Shorts only LHS Golf Shirt (with logo) Closed shoes only (black or brown leather)

#### Students are not permitted to wear:

No high-heeled shoes, or open-toe sandals No mini skirts

#### FREE DRESS FRIDAY

Students may wear clothing of their choice, but <u>MAY NOT</u> wear jeans of any color, shorts, t-shirts, sneakers, or sweat suits. Girls <u>MUST</u> wear skirts or knee-length dresses or uniform/khaki or twill pants. Leggings can be worn under skirts. Shirts <u>MUST</u> be collared. If appropriate attire is not worn, parents will be notified to bring in suitable attire or uniform.

### CONSEQUENCES

If students do not adhere to the school uniform code, they will be subject to disciplinary action as follows:

- 1. First Time warning
- 2. Second Time will result in additional disciplinary procedures.

## ASSEMBLY DRESS

On assembly dress days, full uniform MUST be worn for the entire day, not just for the assembly. On all occasions, students must always keep their shirts/blouses tucked in.
